## Target population



### Women, girls, youths, displaced persons :

- Living in extreme poverty, insecurity and humanitarian challenged areas
- Living with HIV and disabilities.
- Exposed to violent extremism,
- With low access to health, education and protection.
- Most at risk of maternal death, or affected by obstetric fistula.
- Survivors or persons exposed to GBV and harmful practices including forced marriage and female genital mutilation.

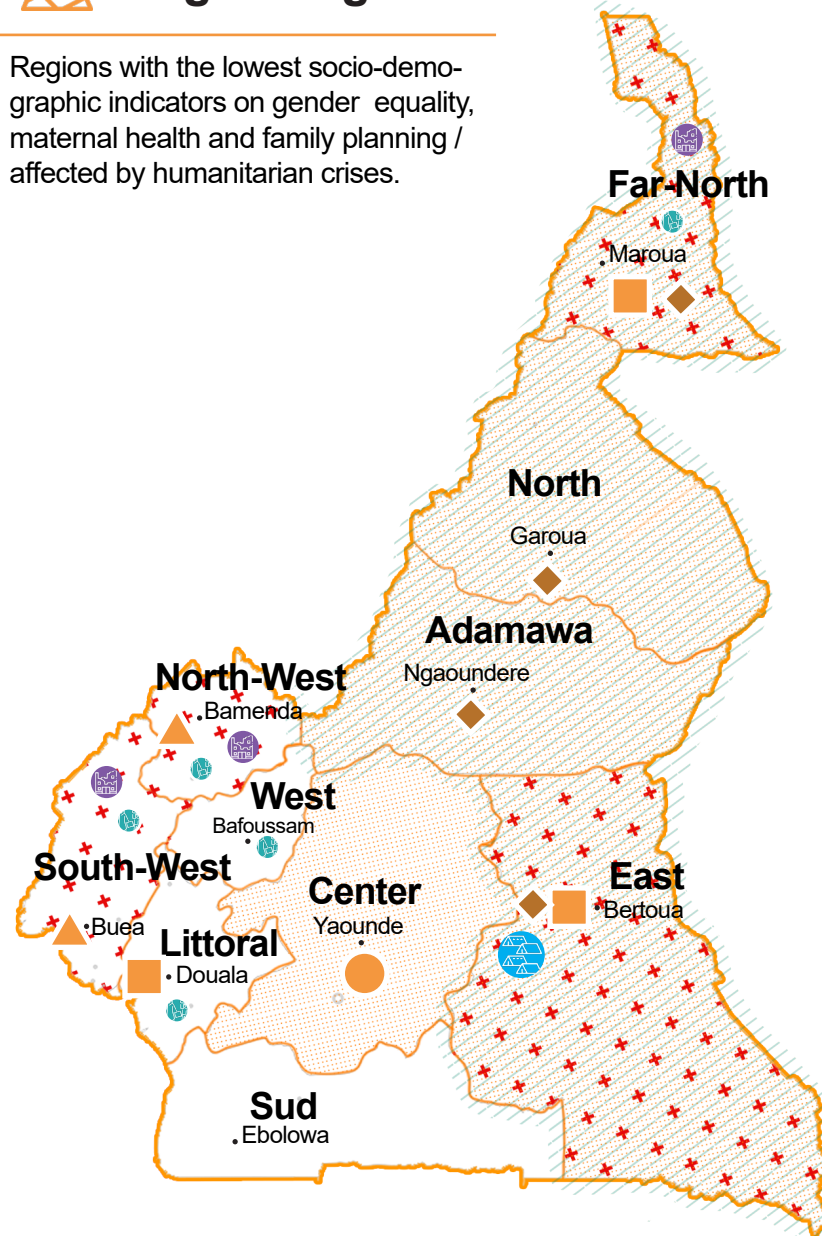

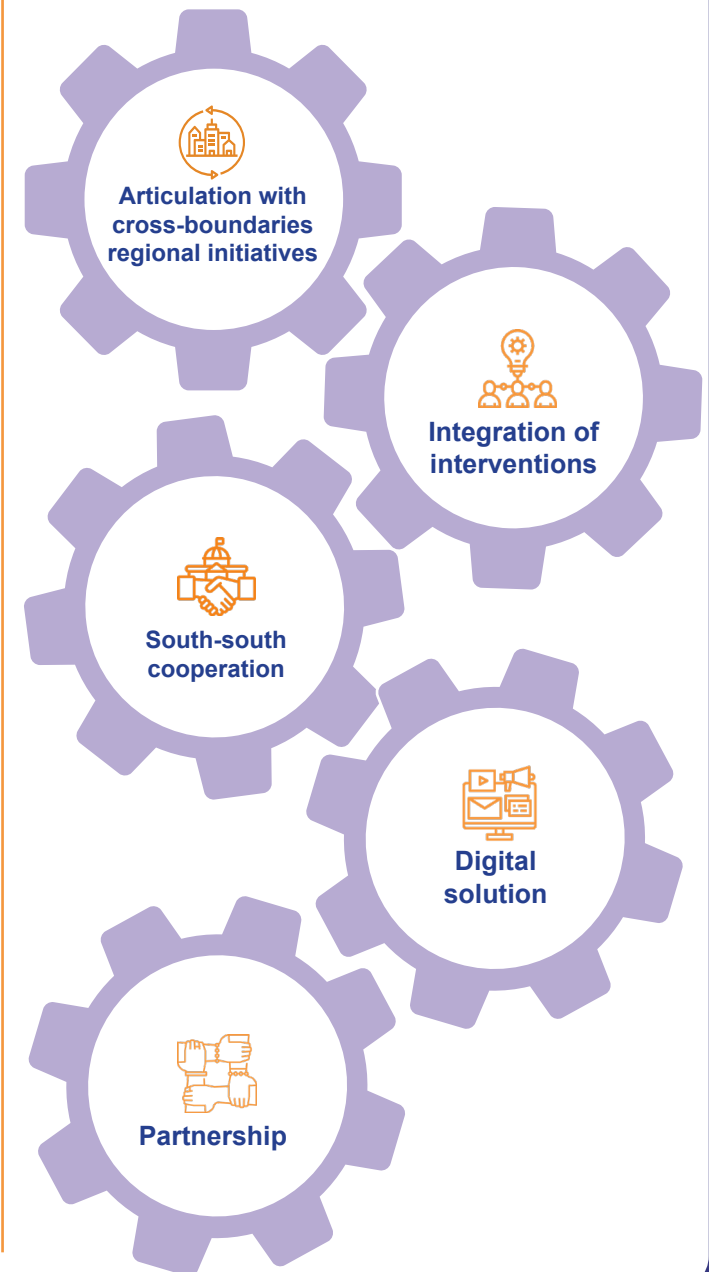

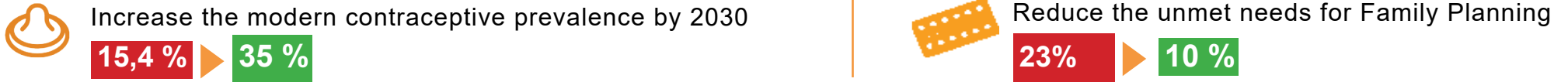
## Output 1 : Family Planning

By 2026, strengthened capacity of systems, institutions and communities to provide high-quality, comprehensive and integrated Family Planning services, including supplies.

### Objectives




Provide modern Family Planning methods in community, including in humanitarian settings.

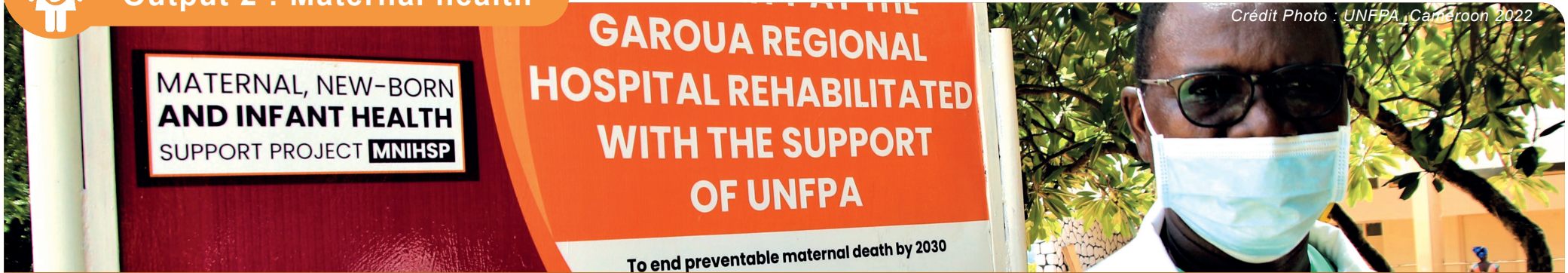

## Output 2 : Maternal health

By 2026, strengthened capacity of the health system, institutions and communities in line with universal health coverage to provide quality and integrated maternal and newborn health services including in humanitarian settings and public health emergencies.

### Objectives



Reduction of the maternal mortality ratio from :  
**406** ▶ **140** / 100,000 live births by 2030

Extending EmONC network coverage including their geolocation

Strengthening sexual and reproductive health delivery through campaigns, mobile clinics in hard-to-reach communities.



## Output 3 : Adolescents & Youths

By 2026, strengthened national capabilities to increase the knowledge and skills, leadership and participation of adolescents and youths, in age appropriate reproductive health, voluntary family planning, family life education including HIV and their resilience to social, economic and environmental shocks.

### Objectives



Increase the number of education facilities that provide age-appropriate family life education programs, including HIV.

## Output 4 : Gender-Based Violence

By 2026, strengthened national capacity for women's empowerment, prevention and response to GBV, harmful social and gender norms and practices particularly female genital mutilation and child marriage, including in humanitarian settings and public health emergencies.

### Objectives



Reduce the prevalence of GBV by

Increase in the number of platforms involving men and youths in the promotion of positive social norms, gender equality and reproductive health and rights.

## Output 5 : Population data for development

By 2026, enhanced national capacity for production, dissemination and use of disaggregated population data for development, monitoring and evaluation of policies and programs especially those related to sexual and reproductive health and reproductive rights, including in humanitarian settings.

### Objectives



Provide technical assistance to the Government and other stakeholders in making data available to guide strategic policies.



Support data collection operations and reporting on health, Family Planning and GBV (Census, DHS, MICS, facility surveys).

### Activities



Providing technical assistance and support to organize the 4th General Population and Housing Census as well as other data collection operations (DHS, MICS, establishment surveys).



Effective implementation and follow up of the post-Nairobi voluntary national commitments actions plan and the Sustainable Development Goals.

Provide technical and financial support for the operationalization of the national roadmap for demographic dividend.
