







# **Target population**



- Living in extreme poverty, insecurity and humanitarian challenged areas
- Living with HIV and disabilities.
- Exposed to violent extremism,
- With low access to health, education and protection.
- Most at risk of maternal death, or affected by obstetric fistula.
- Survivors or persons exposed to GBV and harmful practices including forced marriage and female genital mutilation.




